We are pleased to announce that our very own Blair Witherington will be our featured Keynote Speaker for this year's event. Blair is a Research Scientist, photographer, author, and avid beachcomber. He will present to us *Zen and the Art of Drifting!* Blair and Dawn Witherington are professional naturalists. Blair has his bachelor's and master's degrees in biology from the University of Central Florida and a doctorate in zoology from the University of Florida. He has contributed numerous scientific articles, chapters, and books on sea turtle biology. Dawn is a graphic design artist and scientific illustrator trained at the Art Institutes of Colorado and Fort Lauderdale. Her art and design are prominent in natural history books, posters, and museum exhibits. Blair and Dawn have merged their art, writing, photography, and design in a number of projects, including *Florida's Living Beaches: A Beachcomber's Guide*, *Florida's Seashells*, *Living Beaches of Georgia and the Carolinas: A Beachcomber's Guide*, *Seashells of Georgia and the Carolinas: A Beachcomber's Guide*, and *Our Sea Turtles: A Practical Guide for the Atlantic and Gulf, from Canada to Mexico*.

“Beachy” books of all kinds will be available at the library. *Sea-Beans from the Tropics: A Collector's Guide to Sea-Beans and Other Tropical Drift on Atlantic Shores*, by Perry/Dennis (reprint edition 2010) will be on hand and Ed promises to be around, somewhere! Terri Kirby Hathaway, co-author of *North Carolina's Amazing Coast* will be present all weekend to sign copies of her latest accomplishment! Blair and Dawn Witherington will be with us all weekend with *Florida's Living Beaches* and their most recent *Our Sea Turtles*. Dr. Curtis Ebbesmeyer will have his *Flotsametrics and the Floating World* throughout the weekend, and the ever-popular *The Little Book of Sea-Beans* by Cathie Katz and Paul Mikkelsen will also be available. This year we will again also make available for sale Cathie Katz' beautifully written and illustrated *The Nature of Florida's.....series*.

3:00 to 4:00 pm: *Time to visit tables (tables taken down at 5pm!), enter the Odd-Bean Contest, and prepare for the group photo.*
4 to 4:30: **GROUP PICTURE OUTSIDE THE LIBRARY! Be in it! Bring your camera!**—photos taken by Jim Angy
4:30 pm: **ODD-BEAN** contest judging (for entries submitted all through the weekend). In a baggie with your name, address/phone number place your **largest hamburger bean, largest seaheart, largest sea purse, and prettiest “sea-pig”** from an existing sea-bean collection. “Oddness” will be determined by the judges. These entries DO NOT have to be found in the Saturday morning Bean-A-Thon. Please enter!!!!
