We are pleased to announce that Andy Dinsdale and Linda Emerson will be our featured Keynote Speakers for this year's event. Linda is a coastal environmental educator, writer and activist. In 2014, she founded Wildbluesea(.com), an ocean conservation non-profit based on insights from scientific research, field studies, and collaborative discussion. She has piloted creative initiatives in Florida, North Carolina, the Bahamas and the UK, using the power of the arts to nurture connection to nature, and the neuroscience behind our physical, mental and emotional well-being when we are close to nature, especially water. Andy Dinsdale has worked in community arts, travelled the world, built ancient wooden structures, and delivered education projects with national and local environmental organizations in the U.K. After his life changed with a chance sea-bean discovery, he now specializes in coastal engagement community events including beach clean-ups, surveys, and wildlife recording. Their presentation *Transellantic Travelers* explores the intriguing journey of sea-beans and other drifters against a cultural and ecological backdrop that links North America and the northwest European coast through ocean currents. Using social media and the upsurge in beachcombers focusing on the U.K & Ireland, we can discover these links through sea-bean journeys, as well as the unwanted trash that follows the same routes.

"Beachy" books of all kinds will be available at the library. Sea-Beans from the Tropics: A Collector's Guide to Sea-Beans and Other Tropical Drift on Atlantic Shores, by Perry/Dennis (reprint edition 2010) will be on hand and Ed promises to be around, somewhere! Blair and Dawn Witherington will be with us all weekend with their new book Florida's Living Beaches, Second Edition, and their other most recent Our Sea Turtles. Dr. Curtis Ebbesmeyer will have his Flotsametrics and the Floating World throughout the weekend, and the ever-popular The Little Book of Sea-Beans by Cathie Katz and Paul Mikkelsen will also be available.
